SIGNED INTO LAW BY GOV. WHITMER

Veteran's Property Tax Exemption & Expansion

Eliminates the burden for 100% disabled veterans to file for property tax exemptions

PUBLIC ACT 151 OF 2023

Codify the Affordable Care Act

Protects access to affordable health care while prohibiting discrimination based on pre-existing conditions

PUBLIC ACT 162 OF 2023

Source of Income Discrimination

Prohibits rental discrimination based on source of income, ensuring access to stable housing

PUBLIC ACT 178 OF 2024

UIA Reform

Modernizes the Unemployment Insurance Agency, cracking down on inefficiencies and streamlining their operations

PUBLIC ACT 240 OF 2024

Reproductive Health Act

Breaks down barriers to reproductive health care in Michigan by removing unnecessary regulations

PUBLIC ACT 207 OF 2023

Brownfield Redevelopment TIF

Allows tax increment financing (TIF) to be used for housing development projects, tackling the housing shortage by increasing stock

PUBLIC ACT 92 OF 2023

SENATOR CAVANAGH INVESTING IN OUR COMMUNITIES



2024 Investments

-  **\$10 million** to support small businesses throughout MI, focused on minority-owned entrepreneurs
-  **\$2.5 million** for jail-diversion services within Wayne County
-  **\$2.5 million** to the City of Detroit's Right to Counsel eviction diversion services
-  **\$2 million** to support Redford Township's Community Health and Wellness Center
-  **\$1.1 million** for infrastructure improvements for Detroit's North Rosedale Community House
-  **\$1 million** for North Rosedale's mixed-use affordable housing development in NW Detroit
-  **\$1 million** to an affordable housing project in the Old Redford community
-  **\$750,000** for improvements and increased accessibility to Redford Township Parks
-  **\$550,000** for the City of Detroit's Blight Busters affordable housing project and children's daycare program
-  **\$240,000** for the development of a community greenspace in Detroit's Grandmont Rosedale Neighborhood

2025 Investments

-  **\$10 million** to Detroit's Water and Sewage Department to support its lead line replacement program
-  **\$3 million** for Redford Township's Combined Sewer Overflow Basin for improved clean water infrastructure
-  **\$2 million** to Starfish Family Services in Detroit's Brightmoor Neighborhood to help combat the lack of accessible daycare
-  **\$2 million** for an Invest Detroit affordable senior housing project in NW Detroit
-  **\$2 million** for Redford Township's lead service line replacement
-  **\$1.5 million** to Detroit's Brightmoor Neighborhood for a Community Health and Healing Center
-  **\$1.5 million** to the City of Detroit's Right to Counsel eviction diversion services
-  **\$1.5 million** towards addiction and homelessness prevention in partnership with Detroit Rescue Mission
-  **\$1 million** investment in neighborhood improvements in partnership with Detroit's Blight Busters
-  **\$100,000** for an aging-out of foster care program within the City of Detroit
