Under Governor Whitmer's order, unemployment benefits will be extended to:

- Workers who have an unanticipated family care responsibility, including those who have childcare responsibilities due to school closures, or those who are forced to care for loved ones who become ill.
- Workers who are sick, quarantined, or immunocompromised and who do not have access to paid family and medical leave or are laid off.
- First responders in the public health community who become ill or are quarantined due to exposure to COVID-19.
- Workers laid off with an expectation of returning to work or who suffer a reduction in work hours due to the COVID-19 business closures.

SECRETARY OF STATE OFFICES

All SOS visits are now by appointment only and will be limited to critical transactions including driver's license renewals; title transfers, regardless of type; and testing for an original CDL, chauffeur's, mechanic or recreational license. All late fees have been suspended, and law enforcement officials and the courts have been asked to not penalize expired tags or licenses through April 6th.

HOUSING & MORTGAGE RELIEF

Michigan Governor Gretchen Whitmer has temporarily suspended evictions in Michigan until April 17th.

Freddie Mac is offering mortgage relief options for those who are unable to make their mortgage payments due to a decline in income — including forbearance for up to 12 months — and waiving penalties and fees, halting foreclosure sales/evictions of borrowers in Freddie Mac-owned homes until May 17th, and more. **Website:** MyHome.FreddieMac.com

Fannie Mae homeowners who are adversely impacted by this national emergency may request mortgage assistance by contacting their mortgage servicer. Foreclosure sales and evictions of borrowers are suspended for 60 days. Homeowners impacted by this national emergency are eligible for a forbearance plan to reduce or suspend their mortgage payments for up to 12 months. **Website:** FannieMae.com
